We therefore do not expect that this establishment will generate an excessive amount of noise that would negatively impact neighbours.
 - b) The proximity of the establishment to other social or recreational facilities and public buildings: There are not any social, recreational, or public buildings near the subject property that would conflict with the proposed establishment.

- c) The person capacity and hours of liquor service of the establishment: A person capacity of 65 persons for the outdoor patio and 100 persons for the interior lounge is acceptable; however due to the concerns of adjacent landowners, we would like to suggest the following modified hours of operation: 10:00 am to 8:00 pm on weekdays, and 10:00 am to 10:00 pm on Friday and Saturdays.
- d) The number and market focus or clientele of liquorprimary license establishments within a reasonable distance of the proposed location: There are two neighbourhood pubs 4-5 kilometres away from the subject property that offer a pub-style menu and atmosphere. This proposal is to provide a more rural experience with a focus promoting farm products to residents and tourists. We do not expect this establishment to detract from the business of these Pubs.
- e) Traffic, noise, parking, and zoning: While we do expect that traffic will increase along Meridale Road if this application is successful, we do not expect this establishment to negatively affect overall traffic patterns. Noise is not expected to be an issue due to the location of the facility on the property in relation to surrounding properties and residences. This use is not permitted under CVRD Zoning regulations; however, it is permitted within the Agricultural Land Reserve as specified in the Agricultural Land Commission Act regardless of local government zoning. The applicant has met the requirements of the CVRD Parking Standards Bylaw.
- f) The impact on the community if the application is approved: If the application is approved, we expect the impact to be positive in nature and support the growing agri-tourism sector of the economy of the Cowichan Valley Regional District.
- g) Public notification: This application was referred to the Electoral Area A Advisory Planning Commission (APC) to obtain the views of the general community, and adjacent property owners were notified by hand-delivered information packages, as specified in subsection (10) of section 18 of the Liquor Control and Licensing Regulations. The adjacent landowners that were notified raised concerns regarding the hours of operation and increased traffic volume that may occur as a result of this application. The APC unanimously support this application with a concern expressed regarding the poor intersection at Cameron-Taggart Road and Shawnigan-Mill Bay Road.

- 4.
