DELEGATIONS

D1 CANADA'S SHRINKING WORKFORCE The Economic Development Manager introduced Ken Stratford of the Greater Victoria Economic Development Commission. Ken gave an overview of their Commission. There are one and a half million business start ups per year in BC and half will fold within 3 years. There is a huge opportunity for job creation. They assist 2,500 business start ups in Victoria. Greater Victoria EDC receives no direct Government funding. Facing retired baby boomers and declining birth rate which leads to labour shortage. Forecast shortfall by 2030. Government plans to increase immigration to 8% to handle job capacity. Expansion is on our

doorstep. Expecting 2-3% Tourism expansion. Will see more automated tasks and job pirates. This is an opportunity for Cowichan to brand itself differently. Now is the time to re-invent your community. It is not the time to be conservative. Handout was distributed on startupInteractiveBC.ca.

### Tuesday, February 22, 2011 – Workshop on Sustainable Land-Use Planning and Ecosystem Health in the CVRD

The CVRD Environment Commission and CVRD Environmental Policy Division invite land managers and planners, decision makers, and potential partners to join us for a important land use planning workshop lead by Dr. Brad Stelfox. Your participation will provide critical information to inform our discussion, and recommendations to the Regional District Board. It is important that a variety of voices are present to ensure representation of a range of interests — we hope you can attend.

The 2010 CVRD Corporate Strategic Plan states: "The CVRD seeks to manage...growth to encourage sustainable development and manage resources so that the quality of life enjoyed today will be preserved and enhanced for future generations." This goal recognizes that our regional prosperity relies on a functional environment around us, and on our thoughtful use of the land, goods and services that this environment provides. In order to achieve "sustainable development", we must balance our activities and the benefits they generate with the continued ability of our regional environment to provide a healthy and resilient foundation for these activities. We therefore need tools to help us quantify the economic and ecologic costs and benefits of our actions, and the ecological "carrying capacities" of our region, so that we can evaluate our land-use decisions with respect to these costs, benefits and capacities.

The CVRD and CVRD Environment Commission are sponsoring this workshop to explore an approach to balanced land-use planning, and the cumulative effects of human activities on the ecosystem goods and services in the CVRD, including current effects and a range of plausible future effects. The workshop will be presented by Dr. Brad Stelfox, a landscape ecologist and developer of the ALCES model (A Landscape Cumulative Effects Simulator — <a href="https://www.alces.ca">www.alces.ca</a>). The workshop will introduce a method to conduct an explicit (and transparent, quantified, and defensible) evaluation of the environmental and economic "trade-off" decisions that we are likely to face in the near future in the CVRD. This workshop and process would support identification of future environmental and economic goals for the region, and a range of strategies (e.g., zoning, focused development, best practices, restoration) to achieve these goals.

Due to budget and space limitations this is a by invitation only meeting – if you would like to suggest that others be invited please let us know so that we can coordinate to ensure that space is available.
