DELEGATIONS The discussion on the Environment Commission Work plan was postponed until a future meeting.

CVRD Green Team representatives, Kate Lindsay and Rob Williams, presented a synopsis of what the Green Team is undertaking within the CVRD and what their priorities are. Discussion ensued.

It was moved and seconded that the Environment Commission endorse the work of the CVRD Green Team and recommend to the Board of the CVRD to develop a work plan such that:

a) low-flow toilets be installed in all CVRD buildings;

b) planting of annuals be replaced with planting of food plants; and c) fossil fuel heating/cooling units be replaced with heat pumps or others non-fossil fuel devices.

And further, that surplus funds, if any, from the 2011 Environment Commission budget be used to help fund these initiatives.

ADOPTION It was moved and seconded that the minutes of the June 16, 2011, OF MINUTES Environment Commission meeting be adopted as presented.

Update on the joint Economic Development/Environment Commission planning meeting

Land Committee – Dave Polster. There is a connection between how water and land are managed. We need to learn where to focus targets to most effectively protect our watersheds. Look at groundwater and aquifer depletions. Analysis needs to be done.

Communications Committee – plan to go ahead with our plans to engage students to produce videos on environmental change. It will be advertised as a competition to go out to all youth. Judy Stafford has a link to someone to help who has connections with film industry. Budget of \$5000 was agreed upon at prior meeting.

Action: Kate Miller will send out a prospectus of this project.

Water Committee – The Cowichan Roundtable is a very valuable group. It would be good to initiate other roundtables – for the Chemainus and Shawnigan areas.

It was moved and seconded to help facilitate the establishment of a Shawnigan Watershed Roundtable as a precursor to setting up a Shawnigan Watershed Management Plan.

Agriculture – Judy Stafford

Water affects everything – irrigation for agriculture is very important. Question: how much does Agriculture use, is it used properly, how do we assess this, can we education on how to manage it – ie. drip irrigation? If we contribute there are many other groups that will also contribute. Water quality and conservation ties in with land use and water use. Water balance workshop will take place in November- it is already planned by the Regional Environmental Policy Division.

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Action: Judy will clarify for October meeting what partnerships are available and how much is necessary to participate.

Governance of the Shawnigan Watershed

A proposal to the Cowichan Environment Commission for stimulating development of a collaborative watershed governance mechanism along the lines of the Cowichan Round Table, Technical Committee and Water Board.

Submitted by Bruce Fraser, Commission Member, October 2011

Objective

Establish a Shawnigan Watershed Board or equivalent basin governance structure, based on the Cowichan model, to provide for long-term collaborative management of watershed integrity and health.

Strategy

Introduce experience with the Cowichan model to Shawnigan residents as a potential option for dealing with accumulating watershed issues

Initiative

The CVRD Environment Commission sponsors a program of public information and discussion to enable Shawnigan Watershed residents, water users and land users to consider the Cowichan Round Table and Water Board model as a collaborative means of addressing long-term health of the watershed.

Suggested Process

Contract to research and write the "Cowichan Round Table/Water Board Story" and Commission to publish the brochure for postal circulation in Shawnigan (approx 3200 households)

Article to be prepared at the same time for publication in the Shawnigan Focus community newspaper (mailed direct to 3200 households)

Identification and Assembly of an Agency/Cowichan Tribes/Water Board team that can provide first hand experience with the model

CVRD staff to prepare a summary of Shawnigan Watershed issues and current watershed status research and remediation efforts (and where appropriate those linked locally with Cobble Hill)

Public meeting(s), hosted by the Commission, to introduce members of the Cowichan Round Table and the Water Board team for a discussion of their experience and its potential applicability to the Shawnigan Watershed status and issues Opportunity for Shawnigan Watershed residents, water and land users to comment on the basin round table idea and assembly of suggestions for input to a workshop

Commission sponsored workshop to consider ways and means of inaugurating a Shawnigan Roundtable and suggestions for its terms of reference, launching membership and local leadership

Hold a founding meeting of interested parties to establish a round table or equivalent according to the suggestions arising from the workshop

Establish a follow-up liaison between a Shawnigan Watershed organization and the Cowichan equivalent, particularly to support the inaugural leadership

Assign a CVRD staff member with the responsibility of ensuring that the Shawnigan group is monitored and effectively supported
