BUSINESS ARISING OUT OF MINUTES

CORRESPONDENCE

C1

Correspondence was received from UBCM advising that the Gas Tax General Strategic Priorities Fund and Innovations Fund application for the Duncan/North Cowichan JUB Wastewater Outfall Relocation and Community Integrated Resource Recovery Project was not successful.

John MacKay suggested that another application be submitted for the next round.

It was moved and seconded that the correspondence from UBCM be received and filed.

Correspondence was received from the Cowichan Watershed Board regarding "Non-point Source Pollution".

Brian Dennison advised that the CVRD has re-directed gas tax funding to undertake a stakeholder process in the Cowichan Basin area, which the CVRD are suggesting could include non-point source pollution. It was suggested that Mr. Dennison write the Cowichan Watershed Board requesting he attend their next meeting to discuss this issue.-

It was moved and seconded that the correspondence from the Cowichan Watershed Board be received and filed.

REPORTS R1

Brian Dennison provided an update on the creation of a CVRD function for the Central Sector Liquid Waste Management Plan, advising that the Province has approved the function for 2013, for which \$100,000 has been requisitioned.

R2

A draft RFP for the Joint Utilities Board (JUB) Governance Study was reviewed.

Mr. Dennison asked for direction regarding proceeding with this RFP.

It was moved and seconded that the Municipality of North Cowichan modify the Terms of Reference for the Request for Proposals to investigate alternatives for governance of the JUB lagoon treatment system and circulate the revised Terms of Reference to the Central Sector Liquid Waste Management Plan Steering Committee for input, prior to be approved by the Joint Utilities Board.

MOTION CARRIED

The Committee agreed by consensus that, once the report is complete, the JUB will bring its recommendations back to the Steering Committee for comment prior to the JUB making a decision on the options presented.

It was agreed that the governance determined by this study for the JUB facility could also determine a governance model for any new facility that may evolve.

John MacKay provided an update on the technical study regarding the lagoon treatment process, advising that it will not move ahead until funding is approved by the JUB.

A staff report from Brian Dennison was reviewed regarding options for a public and technical advisory committee.

The Committee discussed the inclusion of agricultural development in the amendment.

It was moved and seconded that it be recommended to the CVRD Board that the CVRD formally notify the Ministry of Environment of the intent to commence an amendment process for the Central Sector Liquid Waste Management Plan.
