Forward:

The State of the Economy (SotE) Sub-committee was struck in December of 2012 to review and revise the State of the Economy Report 2012 as submitted by Economic Development Commission (EDC) member Jane Worton in February of 2012 and resubmitted in November of the same year.

Upon its review of the report in December 2012, the EDC expressed a wish to change the language and tone of the report and tasked a sub-committee to effect this change, and re-present the Report to the Commission at the earliest opportunity. Initially, the Sub-committee was comprised of, Sandra Goth, Roger Hart, and Robert Radford. In February 2013, Russ Jenkins agreed to join the Sub-committee and assist in completing the review.

The initial review was conducted by Sandra Goth, Russ Jenkins, and Robert Radford. The revised version of the SotE Report 2012 was approved by the EDC on 18 April 2013 and presented to the Regional Services Board by Sandra Goth on 24 April 2013. Staff advised that the presentation of the Report was "Well received with supportive comments and interesting questions from many Board members" many of which were recorded and distributed to EDC members.

The Sub-committee was directed to develop a new SotE Report for 2013.

To clarify the next steps regarding the development of an SotE, Sub-committee members Sandra Goth, Russ Jenkins, and Robert Radford met on 22 May 2013. Roger Hart was unable to attend due to personal commitments. It was agreed by Sandra Goth and Russ Jenkins that the task, as requested by the EDC, was to develop recommendations for a SotE Report 2013.

At this meeting, Robert Radford tendered his resignation, citing a number of reasons, stating he would be "happy to volunteer my services to help in updating the official goals and objectives of the Economic Development Commission"

Subsequently, Roger Hart withdrew from the Sub-committee task, citing "neither the expertise nor access to the necessary resources' to participate and his desire to work in partnership with Robert Radford preparing "annual reports that show the EDC's progress".

Sandra Goth and Russ Jenkins agreed to meet weekly to establish recommendations for a Terms of Reference (TOR) for the 2013 Report.

Contact was initiated with six (6) of the seven (7) other Regional Districts on Vancouver Island to determine their approach and status to reporting on their current state of the economy. Five (5) responded with information that was most helpful. It was expected that contact would be made with other Regional Districts where the population and other characteristics reflected those of the CVRD.

Statistics Canada was investigated as the primary source for the required information for future SotE Reports for the CVRD. It is apparent that the new regulations for Statistics Canada may have an adverse impact on the costs and ability to extract relative information.

The 13 and 20 June 2013 planning sessions facilitated by Clemens Rettich Business Consulting Ltd., may change how the EDC defines its role and therefore affect how the EDC goes forward with reports such as the SotE.

Executive Summary:

The Sub-committee for development of the State of the Economy Reports makes the following recommendations for consideration of the EDC:

- The State of the Economy Report (SotE) will be a vibrant and dynamic document that will be the foundation for other deliverables of the Economic Development Commission (EDC) and Economic Development Cowichan Work Plan.
- The SotE will be the source for statistical information and present realities that are the drivers and constraints of economic development in the Cowichan Valley Regional District (CVRD).
- It will provide a context for future economic development activities.
- The production of the SotE will be sufficiently resourced to ensure content that is reliable and useful in understanding the present economic environment of the CVRD.
- The SotE will include a trends analysis to answer the 'what next' and 'so what' considerations for the Board of Directors and staff.

The Recommendations:

- The SotE will be a foundation document for other deliverables of the EDC and Economic Development Cowichan.
- The SotE will be prepared every 5 years following on the most recent census and updated with new information as and when requested.
- The Sustainable Economic Development Strategy (SEDS) will flow from the SotE.
- Progress of the SEDS will be monitored by the EDC at least annually and possibly quarterly.
- The Economic Development Work Plan for CVRD staff will draw from the SotE and the SEDS.

Vision / Objectives:

- To be a dynamic and vibrant document that will describe the present state of the economy based on statistical evidence and realities of the communities, incorporated and unincorporated, within the CVRD.
- It will contain illustrative stories of the economic creativity within the CVRD.
- The beauty of CVRD will be illustrated through photographs and local artwork.

Terms of Reference for a State of the Economy Report:

- The document will identify activity within the geography and the demographics that must be considered when planning for economic development in the region.
- The statistical reporting will be based on the most recent census as reported by Stats Canada, including BC Stats, Service Canada, Vancouver Island Real Estate Board (VIREB), etc.
- Benchmarking comparisons to other regions on Vancouver Island, and select regions of British Columbia will be incorporated into the Report.
- All other statistics will be referenced.

Frequency:

- Each SotE will be a vibrant and dynamic document which will capture the most up to date statistics, community profiles, and trends of the region.
- The SotE will be prepared every 5 years following on the release of the new census numbers, with the most up to date statistics, community profiles, and trends of the region.
- The SotE will be revisited as required to ensure the current state of the CVRD is accurately reflected.
- Changes may occur in the structure of the SotE to accommodate new economic impacts to the CVRD.

Participation:

- The EDC will appoint commission members to a sub-committee to give input into the development of the framework for each separate SotE Report
- The sub-committee will provide progress reports at each regular meeting of the EDC.

Resourcing:

• The Board of Directors will commit the appropriate funds and other resources, including staff and/or consultants, to ensure a timely, well-informed, and useful document.

Timeline:

- An SotE Sub-committee will be formed by the EDC to provide leadership for the development the SotE no later than November of the year to be studied.
- The draft SotE will be completed to meet the budgetary and time constraints of the staff Work Plan.
- The draft SotE will be presented by the end of February to the EDC for initial approvals.
- The EDC will then instruct the Sub-committee to present the SotE by the end of March to the CVRD Board for approval.
- The final document will be ready for publication within thirty days of presentation to the Board.
- Following acceptance of the final document, the SotE Sub-committee will be disbanded.
