An abundance of free events take place at the Cowichan Community Centre between Sept 20-27. The activities include:

- Saturday, Sept. 20: Cowichan Valley Art Council's hands-on community collage.
- Tuesday, Sept. 23: Cowichan Library branch hosts an outdoor herbal workshop with author Sheila Wray and Quw'utsun Elder Della Rice Sylvester.
- **Wednesday, Sept. 24:** M'akola Housing Society presents a community talk and film screening of *Penelakut: Returning to the Healing Circle* at CPAC.
- Friday, Sept. 26: CPAC & Lila Music Centre present *One Heart, One Mind, One Voice,* a multicultural concert experience.
- **Saturday, Sept. 27:** Cowichan Arena hosts an Everyone Welcome Skate, and CPAC invites art lovers to enjoy "The Eclectic Works" Open House in the 3rd Floor Gallery.

This year, Culture Days programming offers meaningful events to connect and reflect on National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Attend the film screening of *Penelakut: Returning to the Healing Circle* at the Cowichan Performing Arts Centre on Sept. 24 to understand the impacts of residential schools in our region. The *One Heart, One Mind, One Voice* performance offers a talk on resistance and reconciliation, followed by a Q&A. The Ts'uubaa-asatx First Nation hosts their Every Child Matters event on Sept. 30. Participate with song, dance, and face paintings while enjoying carving demonstrations and food truck offerings on this important day.
