

Curbside Collection Winter Guidelines

Do you know how to correctly space your tote for successful winter weather collection?

Automated collection vehicles require at least one metre (three feet) of clearance on all sides to collect your garbage, recycling, and organics effectively. During winter weather events, this includes making clearance for snowbanks and other debris. For safety reasons, please do not place your totes on a snowbank or in the roadway; residents are responsible for clearing snow around their totes.

Malahat Fire Rescue Receives Delivery of New Tactical Water Tender

The Cowichan Valley Regional District (CVRD) has delivered a 2,000-gallon Tactical Water Tender to Malahat Fire Rescue on October 12, 2025. This specialized vehicle will improve firefighting in areas with limited water access and support provincial wildfire response.

The tender was purchased from Lak'Was Wildfire Water Service Ltd., an Indigenous-owned company in Comox, BC. CVRD contributed \$100,000 toward the purchase through Electoral Area A's Community Works Fund, part of the Canada Community Building Fund administered by the Union of BC Municipalities. "This investment strengthens safety and resilience in the Cowichan Valley," said CVRD Chair Kate Segall. Fire Chief Tanya Patterson added, "The custom-built unit is ideally suited to our geography and will significantly improve operations.
