

Bright Angel Park Recreation Rejuvenation Project

photo 1

This photo is facing north taken in the main parking area which was reconfigured and surfaced during this project. The view in the photo shows the new washroom building and main intersection of 6 trails including the main accessible loop as well as the shorter direct link between the field, playground and exercise equipment and the washroom building.

The reclaimed greenspace and new picnic area is in the background of the photo.

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photo 2

This photo is facing south west at the main intersection of trails or the hub of the park. This view shows a new two sided kiosk, in ground garbage receptacle, new washroom building and the main parking area behind the split rail fence.

The new septic field for the washroom building is in the background beyond the picnic table.

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photo 3

This photo is facing north along the new accessible trail where it transects a new picnic area. The arched gateway in the background guides park visitors to the suspension bridge over the Koksilah River.

This reclaimed green space was once a vehicle parking area prior to the BAP Recreation Rejuvenation Project.

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photo 4

This photo is facing north west along the northern extent of the new accessible trail.

This location is where the old playground once stood. The site was utilized to provide a natural playscape and small amphitheatre/outdoor classroom.

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photo 5

This photo is facing north along the accessible trail loop that connects the playfield to the new nature playscape and amphitheater/outdoor classroom at the western boundary of the park.

The new 2-2.25 metres wide accessible trail is surfaced with compacted angular screenings and an average longitudinal slope of less than 5%.

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photo 6

This photo is facing north west across the upgraded playfield. This field was regraded providing better drainage and resurfaced with appropriate soil and grass.

The playfield is an unprogrammed recreation area. This field is booked for a variety of recreation and community events.

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photo 7

This photo is facing north towards the new play equipment (background) and shows the intersection between the playground and playfield. Both areas have received new grass seed and are recovering from excavation.

A total of 13 trees were planted in the playground and exercise equipment area.

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photo 8

This photo is facing east on the north side of the playfield looking over the new accessible 2.5 metre wide trail, the 10 exercise stations and the new playground in the background.

New trees and undulating mounds surrounding this area signal a different use and create interesting playful topography around the playground.

This photo is facing north on an inner loop of the accessible trail that is shorter route leading directly from the recreation area of the playfield, playground and exercise stations to the washroom building.

This photo is facing north on the south edge of the playground. In the background is the accessible trail and 10 exercise stations.

The playground incorporates natural materials and utilizes natural colours to connect to the park surroundings.

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photo 11

This photo is facing south above a small Garry Oak restoration area with the new parking lot behind. Cedar split rail fence was used to separate vehicles from the active recreation area. The playground is located to the right where mounding and new trees can be seen.

The new water system is located beyond the building in the background of this image. The utilities are buried along the driveway edge to the new washroom building 150 metres behind this location.

This photo is facing west at the intersection of the accessible trail and the park driveway. The spitrail fencing slows pedestrian traffic before reaching the intersection.

The new parking area playground, exercise stations and playfield are in the background.

This photo is facing east along the eastern section of the accessible trail. This section passes wetlands that are home to western toads, red legged frogs and Pacific chorus frogs.

This portion of the trail connects the lower parking area to the recreation area where the playground, exercise equipment and playfield are located.

This photo is facing north at the new well, water storage and utilities site. The well head and main utilities controls are located in the shed in the background of the image. The water storage necessary for supporting the new washroom building needs (3500 gal) is located underground and accessed through the four valves shown in the photo.
