R. Frost, West Cowichan Facility Coordinator Verbal Report Re: WorkSafe BC

CLSA had a 5 hour inspection on December 1, 2017 by WorkSafe BC and subsequently received an inspection report on December 28, 2017 listing six orders that require attention by February 2, 2018. They are improved documentation, updating of safety plans, implementation of an ammonia isolation lock out system, updating of training manuals, monthly testing of the ammonia sensors and alarms, adjustment of the ammonia room ventilation exhaust stack and to clarify the inhouse response expectations and Fire Department roles when there is a power failure.

CLSA is a "Risk Assessed Plant" which operates under different requirements than Technical Safety BC's latest safety order and has been compliant since 2000.
