

Grant Funding Provides for a New Sewer Service in Cobble Hill

The CVRD is proposing to combine the Twin Cedars and Cobble Hill sewer system service areas into a new sewer system service area. Costs to taxpayers for the new service area (Cobble Hill Village Sewer System Service Area) would be recovered by a combination of a parcel tax and user fees. The estimated annual cost to residential property owners within the proposed service area would be approximately \$900 per unit, per annum. In order to proceed the CVRD needs to obtain public approval through an Alternative Approval Process (AAP).

The proposed new service bylaw has received three readings, and the Province has approved moving forward. Electors (residents and non-residents) of the service area have the opportunity to complete an *Elector Response Form* if they are opposed to the proposal. Forms must be returned to the CVRD by 4:30 p.m., Thursday, September 20, 2018. If more than 29 (10% of 285) electors in the proposed service area are opposed to this proposal the CVRD will be unable to adopt the bylaw, unless a referendum is held.

If you are in favour of the proposal, no action is required.

Harmonizing Electoral Area Official Community Plans

The CVRD is currently undertaking harmonization of its seven Electoral Area Official Community Plans (OCPs) and eight Zoning Bylaws to create one unified OCP and one Zoning Bylaw. This is part of ongoing efforts to harmonise and modernize the Regional District's numerous land use Planning policy and regulatory documents. There is as much as 30 years between the oldest and newest CVRD OCPs. Issues, regulations, and even terminology have changed considerably over this period.

In addition, the harmonization project will reduce the size of the exiting OCPs by about 50%, removing repetitive and sometimes conflicting objectives and policies that unnecessarily clutter and complicate the planning process. The outcome of this administrative exercise will be a single, stream-lined OCP document for all CVRD electoral areas with complementary local area plans for village areas focussing on the particular character of each area. The project also includes harmonizing the CVRD's eight zoning bylaws into a single integrated bylaw to complement and

implement the policies contained with the harmonized OCP.

A steering committee, comprised of the Chairs from each Electoral Area Advisory Planning Commission, has been established to help work through the review process by providing oversight with respect to harmonized policies, land use designations, development permits, etc. it is anticipated that the first draft with be completed by early 2019.

This work reflects the vision set out within the Cowichan 2050 project by improving the coordination and collaboration in land use planning within the region.
