New subscriber? Here are the top 3 things to know about the CDH Replacement Project:

1. We're in the business planning phase

The business plan is step 2 of a 5-step process to replace Cowichan District Hospital.

The business plan will outline the service model, programs, a preliminary design and estimated cost for the proposed hospital.

Once drafted, the business plan will be submitted to the provincial government for approval to proceed to the next steps. We expect the business plan to be completed by the fall of 2019.

2. It's not too late to participate!

If the business plan is approved by the province, the CDH Replacement Project will proceed to step 3: Procurement. This phase will establish who will be building the hospital.

Following Procurement, the project will proceed to step 4: Design and Construction. During this phase, a number of working groups will be formed to provide



feedback and ensure the design reflects the needs and values of the community.
