MAIL BALLOT INSTRUCTIONS

Your mail ballot package contains:

- Voter Registration Form 200M / Non-Resident Application Form (if required) ☐*.
***If box is checked then you must complete the form(s) included in this package as itemized in #1 of the instructions below.**

INSTRUCTIONS

1. ***If you are not on the Voters List***, and you are a **Resident**, fill in the Voter Registration Form 200M ☐*; or
If you are a **Non-Resident** complete the Application to Register as a Non-Resident Property Elector **and** Consent Form(s) ☐*.
2. Mark the ballot and place in the secrecy envelope (#1)
3. Seal the ballot inside the secrecy envelope and place it inside the return mailing envelope addressed the Chief Election Officer (#2).
4. Complete the qualification and declaration form, ensuring you sign it, and include it inside the return mailing envelope (#2) along with the completed voter registration form (200M) or Non-Resident Property Elector Application/Consent Form(s), if those are marked as required.
5. Seal the return mailing envelope (#2).
6. Mail or have delivered the return mailing envelope and its contents to the Chief Election Officer at **175 Ingram Street, Duncan, BC, V9L 1N8**. It must be received **no later than 8:00 p.m., Saturday, November 28, 2020**. Any ballots received after the close of voting will remain unopened and will not be counted in the By-Election.
7. A ballot will also be rejected if the declaration form or the voter registration form (if required) is not completed.

SPOILED BALLOTS

If a mail ballot is unintentionally spoiled, a replacement may be requested by advising the Legislative Services Division at 250.746.2508 or toll free at 1.800.665.3955 of the spoilage and returning the complete mail ballot package by mail, or other appropriate delivery system, to the Chief Election Officer. A new mail ballot package will then be issued to the Elector.
